WHEREAS of the amount of eighty-four million two hundred and nine thousand six hundred and thirty dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of British Guiana and other purposes, for the year commencing the 1st day of January, nineteen hundred and sixtysix, the sum of fifteen million two hundred and thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-three dollars is chargeable by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of British Guiana of sixty-eight million nine hundred and ninety-six thousand two hundred and forty-seven dollars.
