## ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1952.

AN ORDINANCE to validate the filing of Returns by certain Life Assurance Companies, and further to amend the Life Assurance Companies Ordinance, 1930, by enabling the Registrar to extend the time within which Returns may be filed by Life Assurance Companies.

[2nd February, 1952.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with A.D. 1952. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows: -

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Life Assurance Com- Short panies (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be construed and title read as one with the Life Assurance Companies Ordinance, 1930, No. 14 of hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Anything in the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or Extension the Life Assurance Companies (Temporary Modification) Ordin- of time ance, 1942, to the contrary notwithstanding, -

(a) the life assurance company known as the Colonial which certain life Life Insurance Company Limited, in respect of the assurance years nineteen hundred and forty-seven, nineteen companies hundred and forty-eight, nineteen hundred and forty- may nine and nineteen hundred and fifty;

(b) the life assurance company known as the Crown etc. Life Insurance Company, in respect of the year nine- No. 28 of teen hundred and forty-eight, -

may deposit with the Registrar the documents required to be so deposited by subsection (1) of section ten of the Principal Ordinance not later than the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

Amendment of section 10 (2) of the Principal Ordinance No. 19 of 1936. 3. Subsection (2) of section ten of the Principal Ordinance as amended by section two of the Life Assurance Companies (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "the Governor" and "not exceeding three months" of the words "the Registrar" and "not exceeding six months" respectively.
