Anything in any Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding a magistrate shall have power and jurisdiction to sentence any person convicted before him of stealing any explosive under section seventy of the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance as amended from time to time or of having unlawful possession of any explosive under section ninety-seven of the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance as amended from time to time to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months.
