## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 22 OF 1955.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Civil List Ordinance by increasing the amount which shall be payable to Her Majesty for defraying the expenses of certain services.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Civil List (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be construed and read as one with the Civil List Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "thirty-seven thousand six hundred" of the words "forty-nine thousand, eight hundred and fifty".

3. Section four of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "thirty-seven thousand six hundred" of the words "forty-nine thousand, eight hundred and fifty".

Exemption from payment of customs duties by the Governor.

5. No customs duties or bill of entry tax shall be charged, levied or paid on goods imported or taken out of bond by or on behalf of the Governor for his personal use.

6. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January, 1954.
