ORDINANCE No. 5 OF 1956.

An Ordinance to appropriate the supplies granted in the current session of the Legislative Council.

WHEREAS of the amount of thirty-nine million nine hundred and fifty-four thousand and seventy-one dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of this Colony, and for other purposes, for the year commencing on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-six, the sum of three million, three hundred and eleven thousand one hundred and sixty-two dollars has been provided for by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of the Colony of thirty-six million, six hundred and forty-two thousand, nine hundred and nine dollars:
