BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 10 OF 1956.

An Ordinance further to amend the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Town Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "to be published in the Gazette, and also" appearing in the eighth and ninth lines thereof.

Amendment of section 18 of the Principal Ordinance. Amendment of section 24(2) of the Principal Ordinance.

- 3. Subsection (2) of section 24 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—
 - (a) by the substitution of a full-stop for the comma appearing after the words "ensuing year"; and
 - (b) by the deletion of the words "and the revised lists shall be forthwith published in the Gazette."

Repeal and re-enactment of section 134(2) of the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 134(3) of the Principal Ordinance.

4. Subsection (2) of section 134 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor—

"(2) Copies of the report shall forthwith be made avail-

able for inspection at the Town Clerk's Office and a notice to this effect published in the Gazette".

5. Subsection (3) of section 134 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution for the words "and the report so transmitted shall be forthwith published in the Gazette for four successive weeks" appearing therein of the words "and copies of the report so transmitted shall forthwith be made available for inspection at the Town Clerk's Office and a notice to this effect published in the Gazette for four successive weeks".
