An Ordinance to amend the Local Government Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana: -

A.D. 1956.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Local Government Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Short title.

Cap. 150.

Amendment of section 21 of the Prinpal Ordinance.

2. Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after the word "officers" in paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of the words "and the regulation of pensions and gratuities payable by village councils and country authorities."

Amendment of section 84 of the Principal Ordinance.

- 3. Section 84 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto after subsection (7) of the following new subsection—
- "(8) The local authority of a village or country district may, in accordance with by-laws made by the Board for such purpose award pensions and gratuities to any of its officers or servants and such pensions and gratuities shall be paid out of the general revenue of the local authority."

Validation of payments of pensions and gratuities.

4. All payments of pensions and gratuities made by any local authority of a village or country district to any of its officers or servants prior to the commencement of by-laws relating to pensions and gratuities made by the Board under section 21 (1) (b) of the Principal Ordinance as amended by section 2 of this Ordinance shall be, and are hereby declared to be, valid from the date on which such payments were made.
