BRITISH GUIANA.

[THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.]

ORDINANCE NO. 33 OF 1930.

An Ordinance to amend the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1903, with respect to the sale of articles which have been illegally taken from Crown Lands and seized in consequence thereof.

A.D. 1930.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legistative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1930, and shall be construed with the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1903, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance) and any amending Ordinance.

Short Title. No. 32 of 1903. A mendment of sec. 26 of Ord. 32 of 1903. 2. Section twenty-six of the Principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the words "the article shall be sold publicly by, or by order of the Magistrate," in place of the words "sell the same, by himself or by some person authorised by him in writing, publicly to the highest bidder."

Amendment of sec. 29 of Ord. 32 of 1903,

- 3. Section twenty-nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a.) by re-numbering the section as section 29 (1), and by deleting the proviso thereto, and
 - (b.) by adding the following as sub-section (2)—
 - "(2.) The Governor may, by general regulation or special order, direct that an upset price shall be fixed with respect to sales under section twenty-six or this section, and if, at any sale where the upset price is fixed a sum less than the upset price is offered for any of the articles so put up for sale, such article shall become the property of His Majesty."
