A BILL

Intituled

An Ordinance to appropriate the supplies granted in the current session of the Legislature.

WHEREAS of the amount of seventy-seven million, one hundred and forty-one thousand and forty-seven dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of British Guiana and other purposes, for the year commencing the 1st day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-five, the sum of fifteen million, seven hundred and thirty thousand, four hundred and sixty-seven dollars is chargeable by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of British Guiana of sixty-one million, four hundred and ten thousand, five hundred and eighty dollars.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:-

A D. 1965.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Short title. Ordinance, 1965.

SCHEDULE

Accountant General shall on the warrant of the fray expenses of Civil Government and other purposes.

Schedule.

2. The Accountant General shall on the warrant of the fray expenses of Governor or of the Minister responsible for finance, pay from the annual revenue of the year, commencing on the 1st January, 1965, and other resources of British Guiana a sum not exceeding in the aggregate sixty-one million, four hundred and ten thousand, five hundred and ten thousand and ten thousan dred and eighty dollars as set forth in the schedule to this Ordinance for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes during the said year.
