A BILL Intituled

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE INTERPRETATION ORDI-NANCE.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:-

This Ordinance may be cited as the Interpretation (Amend-Short, title. ment) Ordinance, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Cap. 5. Interpretation Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

In subsection (1) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance the definitions of "British India" and "India" shall be repealed.

3. At the end of section 9 of the Principal Ordinance there shall

be inserted the following section:-

"Time for performance of act on c of act on cer-tain day.

9A. Where by or under any Ordinance anything is required or authorised to be done on a certain day, then, if that day is a Sunday or public holiday, unless the contrary intention appears, the thing shall be deemed to have been done in due time if it is done on the next following day which is not a Sunday or public holiday.

Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended in the following manner:-

Insertion new section 9A in Chap-ter 5.

In subsection (1) paragraph (d) shall be deleted and the (a) following substituted therefor:-"(d) all rules shall be published in the Gazette and shall have the force of law on the date of publication unless it is provided in the rules that they shall come into operation on some other date: Provided that notifications, directions, notices and forms need not be published unless expressly required by the Ordinance conferring the power to make the rules; and"

In subsection (2) for the words "rules and regulations, regulations and by-laws." there shall be substituted the words "regulations, by-laws, proclamations, orders, notifications, directions, notices and forms.'

At the end of section 21 the following section shall be Insertion of new section 21A wherever forms are prescribed under any enacts. Ter 5. inserted:-

Wherever forms are prescribed under any enactment they may be used with any variations and additions which do not affect the substance or are not calculated to mislead, which the circumstances of the particular case require, and when so used shall be good and sufficient in law.'

At the end of section 37 of the Principal Ordinance there Amendment shall be inserted the following subsection:-

"Power to appoint includes power to suspend or dismiss.

(5) In any case in which, by any law or ordinance now in force in the Colony, a power to make any appointment is conferred, then, unless the contrary intention appears the authority having power to make the appointment shall also have power to remove, suspend, re-appoint or reinstate any person appointed in the exercise of the power.

**OBJECTS AND REASONS** 

This Bill seeks to make various amendments to the Principal

Ordinance which have been found to be desirable.

2. The definitions of "India" and "British India" are obsolete and clause 2 provides for their repeal.

3. Clause 3 provides for doing an act on the following day where the day for doing it is a holiday.

4. Clause 4 redefines "rules" in section 21 to include other forms

of subsidiary legislation.

5. Clause 5 provides that variations and additions in prescribed forms to meet particular requirements shall not invalidate them.

6. Clause 6 provides that a power to appoint to any post includes power to suspend or dismiss a person from such post-
