This Bill seeks to permit the payment to the dependants of the members of the police force and the two civilians killed at Lethe during the illegal uprising in the Rupununi, of a pension computed accordance with the formula obtainable for the payment of a dec

benefit under the National Insurance and Social Security Act, 1969.

The adoption of that formula would enable a higher pension to be paid to the dependents of the members of the police force than that payable under the Pensions Ordinance, 1957.
