

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 16(2) OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS
FOLLOWS:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Parcel Post (Surface Rates) Order, 1957.
2. The rates of postage chargeable in respect of parcels addressed for transmission by surface mail to the destinations set out in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be those set out in the second, third, fourth and fifth columns respectively of the said schedule.
3. The postage chargeable according to the rates hereinbefore mentioned shall in all cases (except as otherwise provided in the Parcel Post Regulations*) be prepaid at the time of posting, and such prepayment shall be effected by means of adhesive postage stamps.
4. This Order shall come into force on the 1st of January, 1958.
