THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE (Chapter 132)

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE DIRECTOR OF POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:-

- These Regulations may be cited as the Telephone (Amendment) Regulations, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Telephone Regulations\*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

- The charges for the use of trunk lines for broadcasts shall be based upon a rate of 10 cents per minute for each 20 miles or portion thereof between exchanges.

 The charge for the transmission of the message of advice in connection with a personal call under regulation 29 shall be 20 cents".

6. These Regulations shall come into force on the 27th March, 1960.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations amend the Telephone Regulations so as to vary the authorised charges for telephone services and to effect certain other minor changes consequent upon the introduction of the new automatic telephone system.
