The yield from the Tax on attendances at Race Meetings was \$2,300 as against \$3,439 in 1958 and \$3,483 in 1957. Collections of the $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ Film Tax in accordance with the provisions of section 7 of the Tax Ordinance amounted to \$53,790 as compared with \$54,129 in 1958 and \$55,296 in 1957. These collections remain on deposit pending the production of certificate that Income Tax Liability has been discharged.

All arrears of Entertainment Tax and Film Tax have been placed in the hands of the Crown Solicitor for recovery by parate execution in terms of section 66 of the Tax Ordinance.

SWEEPSTAKE TAX

7. The decline in the popularity of Sweepstakes sponsored by the Demerara Turf Club continued and this is reflected in the short fall of \$2,499 under this subhead.

BREACHES OF LICENSING LAWS

8. Departmental vigilance to prevent evasion was maint ined during the year and 1351 cases of breaches of licensing laws were detected. Of these 1159 were dealt with departmentally in terms of section 11 of the Miscellaneous Licences Ordinance. Fines collected amounted to \$3,864. In 192 cases where the unpaid licence duty exceeded \$50 or defaulters did not avail themselves of the option of being dealt with departmentally, summonses were issued. Fines imposed by magistrates amounted to \$1,087.
