BRITISH GUIANA

REPORT ON THE GENERAL ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY- 1961. Sir.

I have the honour to submit my report on the 1961 General Election.

#### 1. THE NEW CONSTITUTION.

Except as otherwise provided, the provisions of the British Guiana (Constitution) Order in Council 1961 and of the constitution annexed thereto came into force by proclamation No. 5/1961 issued on the 18th July, 1961. Article 22 and Parts III and VI of the Constitution came into force on the 5th September, 1961, vide Order No. 63/1961.

Article 46 of the Constitution provides that there shall be two chambers of the Legislature, viz the Senate and the Legislative Assembly. As regards the composition of the two chambers, it is laid down that the Senate shall consist of thirteen members who shall be appointed by the Governor. Article 53 provides that the Legislative Assembly shall consist of thirty-five elected members; if however, any person who is not a member of the Legislative Assembly is elected to be Speaker of the Assembly he shall, by virtue of holding the office of Speaker, be a member of the Assembly in addition to the thirty-five members.

### 2. NEW LEGISLATION.

A complete list of amendments to the Special Registration Ordinance Chapter 65, the Special Revisal Ordinance No. 2 of 1953, and the Special Revisal Ordinance No. 9 of 1956 and also to the Representation of the People Ordinance, No. 3 of 1957 is set out below:-

- (a) The Electoral Provisions (Registration) Ordinance, No. 10 of 1961.
- (b) The Electoral Provisions (Registration) Regulations, No. 3 of 1961.
- (c) The Electoral Provisions (Registration (Amendment) Regulations, No. 9 of 1961.
- (d) The Representation of the People (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 21 of 1961.
- (e) The Representation of the People (Amendment) Regulations, No. 11 of 1961.
- (f) The Representation of the People (Remuneration of Officers) (Amendment) Regulations, No. 15 of 1961.
- (g) The Legislature (Disqualification) Ordinance, No. 33 of 1961.
- (h) The Legislature (Appointment, Election and Membership Controversies) Ordinance, No. 34 of 1961.

#### 3. ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

Based on the recommendations contained in the Report of the British Guiana Electoral Boundaries Commission, 1960 appointed in July 1960, to de - limit new constituency boundaries in preparation for the first election to be held under the new Constitution, the Governor by Order No. 5 of 1961 made under the British Guiana (Electoral Provisions) Order in Council, 1960 directed that British Guiana be divided into thirty-five electoral districts as set out in the Schedule thereto for the purpose of each returning one member to the Legislative Assembly.

The last Commissioner in framing his proposed constituencies by an appropriate aggregation of the 1,274 Emmeration Sub-Districts used for the 1960 Population Census, had applied a "quota of population" calculated at 16,000 persons for 35 seats based on the total population of 560,000 estimated by the 1960 Census. However, in the final result, in view of "special considerations affecting individual Electoral Districts", 14 "below-quota" and 21 "above-quota" seats were apportioned.

#### 4. POLLING DIVISIONS.

There were established in each electoral district varying numbers of polling divisions with such boundaries as appointed by the Chief Electoral Officer.

The break-down was done on a basis of approximately 400 electors per polling division in a rural area, and 600 electors per polling division in an urban area. In the aggregate 688 polling divisions were established, which, with a total electorate of 246,120 gave an average of 360 per polling division.

Maps showing polling divisions were prepared for 30 of the 35 Electoral districts. Maps were not prepared for Electoral Districts No. 25 Upper Demerara River, No. 32 Pomeroon, No. 33 North West, No. 34 Mazaruni-Potare and No. 35 Rupunumi.

The descriptions of boundaries of polling divisions were posted up on public buildings in the Electoral Districts.

#### 5. THE ENUMERATION.

The Order of the Governor directing the commencement of enumeration for compiling a new register of electors was issued on the 20th February, 1961. The appointed day for commencing the enumeration was fixed for the 1st March and the qualifying date was the 3rd April, thus a period of over a month was allowed for enumeration in the field.

Previously, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Chief Electoral Officer, appointed for each of the 35 Electoral Districts an Electoral Registrar and 17 Deputy Electoral Registrars to assist the Electoral Registrars in the discharge of their duties in the following electoral districts:

As soon as the Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars were appointed they began selecting their enumerators and instructing the latter in their duties. The following pamphlets were printed for guidance:—
(i) Instructions to Enumerators, (ii) Instructions to Electoral and Deputy Electoral Registrars (General), (iii) Instructions to Electoral Registrars on the Preparation of the Preliminary Lists, and (iv) Registrar's duties following receipt of preliminary lists.

The Record Book in which the enumerator entered the particulars of qualified persons, carried a number of pages in alphabetical order, each page being divided into five columns: Surname, Other names, Occupation, Address and Consecutive number.

After enumeration in the field, the enumerators next job was to complete one copy only on Form No. 4 "Preliminary List of Electors" from all the names entered in the Record Book, in strict alphabetical order. The preliminary lists reflected a total of 241,814 electors.

#### 6. THE REVISION OF THE LISTS.

After the expiration of the period allowed for enumeration i.e. 1st March to 3rd April, the enumerators began making copies of the lists of names, addresses and occupations of persons appearing in the Record Book on forms headed "Preliminary List of Electors" arranging the surnames in alphabetical order. In Georgetown a "typists' pool" of about 3 dozen typists was established for the preparation of typewritten copies of the preliminary lists using litho typewriter ribbons, carbon paper, white correcting fluid and special paper including continuation sheets, blank sheets and spare headed sheets. In a few cases, it was practicable for the Electoral Registrar in rural areas to arrange for the typing in his electoral district. The typing of the lists was completed within 18 days and the preliminary lists of electors were affixed to a building in the polling division on the 1st May. Qualified persons whose names were omitted from the preliminary lists were allowed up to the 18th May to make claims for inclusion. Persons who wished to object to the inclusion of any name in the register were allowed up to the 5th June to do so. The total number of claims and objections received was 4,306 which represents 1.7% of the total electorate of 246,120 after all insertions were made, in comparison with the preliminary figure of 241,814.

#### 7. PRINTING OF THE FINALLY REVISED LISTS.

Printing of the Lists was done on a small offset-litho plant under the supervision of the Controller of Government Printing and Stationery.

The Original copies of the lists were typed under the supervision of the Electoral Office, on stout bond paper using silk typewriter ribbons for sharp photo reproduction. The lists were laid out two columns per page; and were reduced by 10% during reproduction to a page size of 8½ x 13½ . Typing on paper for photo reproduction was selected in preference to direct typing on paper plates in order to facilitate corrections and speedy production.

The matter was transferred to litho plates by means of Zerography. Working in an air-conditioned room and using 12 Zero selenium plates, 2,500 paper plates (representing the number of pages of the Preliminary Electoral Roll) were produced within 14 working days operating two shifts per day, but most of the time the flow of original copies was not sufficient to keep the equipment working to full capacity.

Two Multilith, Model 1250, presses and one Davidson Dual-Lith, Model 255, offset press were used for the printing. Two separate plates were run simultaneously on the Dual-Lith press, this being possible through the was of a greeved rubber blanket.

Fifty copies of the Preliminary Lists of Electors were printed, and 500 copies of the final Lists comprising the matter in the Preliminary Lists with 671 pages of addenda containing additions and deletions to be made to the original particulars. The final Lists were completed in approximately six weeks.

Commercial lithographic facilities of the conventional type had been used on previous occasions for printing the Lists of Electors. The provision of small offset facilities in combination with Zerography, under immediate official supervision, proved more advantageous in many respects, and resulted in substantial economy.

#### 8. THE WRITS OF ELECTION.

The Writs of Election were issued by the Governor to the Returning Officers of the 35 Electoral Districts on the 18th July, 1961. Nomination Day was fixed for the 27th July and Polling Day for the 21st August. The Writs were returnable not later than the 29th August.

### 9. PREPARATIONS FOR THE ELECTION.

A Returning Officer was appointed by the Governor for each of the 35 electoral districts and an Election Clerk was appointed by the Chief Electoral Officer for each Returning Officer. A Deputy Returning Officer was provided for each of the following districts: No. 5 Berbice East, No. 7 Berbice River, No. 24 Lower Demerara River, No. 25 Upper Demerara River, No. 29 Boerasirie, No. 30 Essequibo Islands, No. 33 North West, and No. 35 Rupumuni, while 3 Deputy Returning Officers were allocated to No. 34 Mazaruni-Potaro.

Each of the Returning Officers, with the approval of the Commissioner of Elections, appointed a Presiding Officer and an Assistant Presiding Officer for each polling-place in his district. The Poll Clerks were appointed by the Returning Officer.

As regards the establishment of polling-places, the Returning Officers selected for each polling division in an electoral district a number of polling-places as directed by the Chief Electoral Officer. For the 688 polling divisions comprised within the 35 electoral districts, a total of 725 polling-places was established.

#### 10. PUBLICITY.

Immediately before the commencement of the compilation of the 1961 Voters' Register, the Chief Electoral Officer gave a broadcast talk in which he invited persons qualified to vote to co-operate with the enumerators. From time to time further radio talks by the Chief Electoral Officer were broadcast offering hints for lodging claims for inclusion in and objections to the preliminary list of electors.

Officers of the Government Information Services maintained a steady flow of radio announcements during and after the enumeration campaign and up to polling day.

Full instructions regarding the enumeration campaign were given in Hindi on the radio programme "Indian Song Time".

Shortly before nomination day, the Commissioner of Elections gave a radio talk focusing attention on the preparations for the General Elections including the physical arrangements made for polling e.g. polling compartments, ballot boxes, stamping instruments, electoral ink etc. In view of modifications in the sequence of voting, it became necessary to revise the film "How to X-ercise Your Vote" produced in 1957, by supplementing the commentary with visual aid. Arrangements were made by the Chief Electoral Officer for the printing of 20,000 copies of a poster entitled "How to Vote".

#### 11. NOMINATION OF CAMDIDATES

On the 27th July, 107 candidates were nominated for the 35 electoral districts. The electoral district with the largest number of candidates was No. 13 Demerara Coast-Central which received 9 nominations, but 2 candidates withdrew subsequently. Six electoral districts recorded 2 nominations each - the smallest number in any electoral district.

### 12. THE POLL.

The poll which was taken in each of the 725 polling-places by secret ballot between the hours of six in the morning and six in the afternoon on election day, the 21st August, 1961, was conducted in a quiet and orderly manner. Voting was particularly heavy between 6.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m., and during these hours, there were waiting queues at most polling-places.

It was reported that in some instances, the Presiding Officers were demonstrating to Electors on the official ballot papers and not on the specimen ballot papers provided for that purpose. At one polling-place, the Presiding Officer at the request of the candidates sub-agents, permitted the latter to see how he marked the ballot papers on behalf of incapacitated persons contrary to the provisions of the Ordinance.

There was some controversy between Presiding Officers and Polling Agents and Sub-Agents taking out of the polling-place marked copies of the register or parts thereof. These agents and sub-agents were soundly warned of the consequences, should they communicate any information that might be obtained from such marked list.

Voting at the Palms, Brickdam posed a problem in the early stages as the electors, their proxies and friends all turned up to vote. As only a small number of electors had exercised their vote by 10.00 a.m. additional staff had to be recruited and extra polling compartments installed.

It would seem that some Polling Agents of the candidates were not properly advised that there could be only one representative at each polling-place, as in a few instances Polling Agents turned up with assistants, who, of course were not permitted to remain in the polling-place.

At Best Hospital, the Presiding Officer issued by mistake, 9 tendered ballot papers for ordinary ballot papers. Subsequently, the electors to whom tendered ballot papers had been issued were invited to vote again and these tendered ballot papers were cancelled.

The Presiding Officer at a polling-place in Electoral District No. 24 Lower Demerara River caused 84 ballots to be rejected, he having written the number of the elector on each of them.

#### 13. THE FINAL COUNT.

In the majority of cases the final count commenced a few hours after the close of the poll, and by mid-night twenty-three declarations had been made. The counts in ten Electoral Districts were completed on the 22nd. One other was completed on the 23rd and the remaining one not until the 28th owing to the late delivery of one ballot box from a remote area where the air strip had been under water.

Thirty-three of the results were clear cut victories, the biggest majorities being obtained in Electoral District No. 25 Upper Demerara River with a majority of the first over the second candidate of 4,765 and Electoral District No. 3 Corentyne-Central with a majority of 4,728. The closest result was recorded in Electoral District No. 17 Georgetown-North where there was a difference of only 27 votes between the two candidates.

Twenty-seven candidates forfeited their deposits as the number of votes polled by these candidates, who were not elected, did not exceed 15% of the total number of votes polled by all the candidates. Accordingly, amounts totalling \$6,480 were paid by the Returning Officers to the Accountant General to the credit of the general revenue of the Colony.

Deposits amounting to \$2,160 lodged by nine candidates who withdrew before polling day were also forfeited and paid to the credit of revenue.

Out of an electorate of 246,120 a total of 218,357 votes was cast or 88.7 per cent.

The total number of rejected votes was 1,768 accounting for a percentage of .8 of the votes cast.

#### 14. THE WORK OF THE POLICE.

Police arrangements achieved the following objectives for which they were designed!-

- Ensuring that voting at each polling-place was uninterrupted and orderly;
- 2. prevention and detection of offences specified in the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957;
- 3. preservation of law and order throughout the country;
- 4. affording opportunity for all ranks to exercise their vote.

In accordance with instructions issued, ranks for duty at polling-places were, as far as possible, posted at the polling division in which they had been registered to vote. Arrangements were made for the relief of members of the Force on duty at Polling-Places other than where they were required to vote. When relieved such members of the force voted in person at their respective polling-places and then returned to their Stations.

Instructions were also given to those ranks on other duties to arrange to vote in person during the periods off duty, e.g. meal times. The Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957 provides for members of the Police Force employed by the Returning Officer at the date of the poll for a purpose connected with the election to vote by proxy. Several members of the Force took advantage of this facility.

#### 16. REPRESENTATION PETITIONS.

Six Representation Petitions were filed in the Supreme Court after the 1961 election and these related to the following electoral districts, namely:

- (i) Electoral District No. 17: Georgetown-North
- (ii) Electoral District No. 18: Georgetown-Central
- (111) Electoral District No. 23: Houston

- (iv) Electoral District No. 26: Canals Polder
- (v) Electoral District No. 52: Pomeroon
- (v1) Electoral District No. 35: Rupunumi.

## (i) <u>Electoral District No. 17: Georgetown-North.</u>

A petition was presented by Andrew Leonard Jackson against the successful candidate Randolph Emanuel Cheeks and the Returning Officer Arthur William Good, on the grounds that:-

- (a) Corrupt and illegal practices were committed in reference to the said election for the purpose of promoting the election of the said Randolph Emanuel Cheeks and did so extensively prevail that they may be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the said election.
- (b) The election was not conducted in accordance with the principles laid down in the Ordinance and that such non-compliance may be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the said election.
- (c) The said Randolph Emanuel Cheeks by his agents and other persons on his behalf with his knowledge and consent was guilty of certain illegal and corrupt practices contrary to sections 74 and 80 of the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957.

Particulars of the said allegations were supplied by Order of the Court. As against the Returning Officer it was alleged inter alia, that he wrongfully cancelled the appointment of 33 proxies. It was also alleged that at one polling station, polling did not commence until 6.13 a.m. and that a proxy form was issued in respect of a voter who had made no application for one. Various other allegations were made in the particulars supplied.

The petition was heard before Mr. Justice K.L. Gordon on the 11th, 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th days of November, 1961 and the court delivered judgement on the 29th day of November, 1961 dismissing the petition and awarding costs to the first respondent. No costs were awarded to the Returning Officer. The Court held that the proxy papers which were alleged to have been wrongly cancelled by the Returning Officer were issued in error and were mullities. The Court, however, found that the Returning Officer through his subordinates, transgressed the regulations when one Etwaria also called (Buck) who was not a voter, was inadvertently or otherwise permitted to vote; the Court held that this single act could not have affected the result of the election, and it could not be concluded from that act that the election was not substantially conducted in accordance with the law. On the other allegations, the Court held that the petitioner had failed to establish these beyond reasonable doubt in accordance with the standard of proof required by law in such cases.

The Court held Mr. Cheeks duly elected, and certified accordingly to the Governor and Speaker of the Legislative Assembly in accordance with Section 31(b) of the Legislature (Appointment, Election and Membership Controversies) Ordinance, 1961.

#### (ii) Electoral District No. 18: Georgetown-Central.

A petition was presented by Mrs. Winifred Gaskin against the successful candidate Peter Stanislaus d'Aguiar and the Returning Officer Elewyn Valentine Viapree. The allegations in this petition included allegations that the elections were not conducted in accordance with the principles laid down in the Ordinance, allegations of corrupt and illegal practices said to be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the election, treating, bribery, and various illegal acts, certain particulars whereof were furnished by Order of the Court.

The petition was heard before Mr. Justice B.O. Adams on the 28th, 29th and 30th days of November, 1961 and the 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 11th and 12th days of December, 1961. Judgement was delivered by the Court on the 20th day of December, 1961.

The Court held that, upon consideration of all the evidence, the various charges were not established, and held that Mr. d'Aguiar was duly elected. The Court certified accordingly to the Governor and the Speaker. Costs were awarded to both respondents.

# (iii) Electoral District No. 23 - Houston.

A petition was presented by Hamilton Green against the successful candidate George Mc Linton Henry and the Returning Officer Lloyd Lemox Godette on the following grounds:-

- (a) The election was not conducted in accordance with the principles laid down in the Ordinance and that such noncompliance may be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the said election.
- (b) Corrupt and illegal practices were committed in reference to the said election for the purpose of promoting the election of the said George Mc Linton Henry and did so extensively prevail that they may be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the said election.
- (c) The said George Mc Linton Henry was by himself, his agents and other persons on his behalf with his knowledge and consent guilty of corrupt practices contrary to section 80 of the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957.

Particulars were supplied by Order of the Court. The particulars included allegations to the effect (i) that one presiding officer did not at the hour fixed for opening the poll in the presence of the cardidates' agents and such electors as were present, open the ballot box and ascertain that there were no ballot papers therein; (ii) that one presiding officer voted for electors who were not incapacitated by blindness or other physical cause and did not administer the prescribed cath; (iii) that one presiding officer refused to issue a voter with a ballot paper, and (iv) that 13 persons under the age of 21 years voted. It was alleged as against the first respondent Mr. Henry that one Scokhoo, procured by Mr. Henry's agent Mr. Ashton Chase, personated a voter named Mohamed Yusuf.

The petition was heard before Mr. Justice H.A. Fraser on the 20th, 21st, 22nd, 23rd and 24th days of November, 1961 and judgement was delivered by the Court on the 27th November, 1961.

The Court held that ground (b) abovementioned must be taken to have been abandoned by the Petitioner and that a single corrupt practice could not satisfy the requirements on which this ground was based. As regards the incident that a presiding officer voted for persons not incapacitated as alleged, the Court held that there were certain flagrant breaches of the principles set out in the Ordinance relating to the conduct of the elections and while the Court was unable to find that the result of the election was thereby affected, the Court was of the opinion that the petitioner was justified in making the complaints under ground (a); as regards the incident concerning the failure of a presiding officer to open the ballot box at the hour fixed for commencement of polling, the Court held that on the facts of this incident as alleged and admitted, there was a technical breach but there was no non-compliance with the principle. The Court found that no ballot paper was refused a voter as alleged.

In relation to the third ground of the petition set cut at (c) above, the Court held that upon consideration of all the evidence it was satisfied beyond all reasonable doubt that Mr. Ashton Chase, the agent of the first hamed respondent, aided and abetted Sookhoo in the corrupt practice of personation and accordingly granted the prayer of the petition and declared the election of Mr. Henry void. The Court certified accordingly to the Governor and to the Speaker.

The petition against the Returning Officer was dismissed but each party was ordered to bear his own costs.

## (iv) Electoral District No. 26: Canals Polder

A petition was presented by Robert Augustus Mitchell against Fenton Harcourt W. Ramsahoye the successful candidate. The petitioner sought to void the election on the ground that the respondent committed an illegal practice in connection with the election, to wit, making a contract on or before 21st August, 1961 with one Udit Persaud whereby the said Udit Persaud agreed to convey electors and/or their proxies to and from the polls by motor-car in consideration of the respondent supplying them with gasolene and making a payment pursuant to the said contract at the gasolene station on one Carryl on the 21st August, 1961. The petition was heard before the Chief Justice on the 31st October, 1961 and on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th of November, 1961 and judgement was delivered on the 13th November, 1961.

The Court held that upon the evidence the charge was not proved against the respondent and that the respondent was duly elected. The Court certified accordingly to the Governor and the Speaker as required by law. Costs were awarded to the respondent.

#### (v) Electoral District No. 32: Pomeroon.

A petition was presented by Ptolemy Alexander Reid against the success-ful candidate Mr. John Bernard Caldeira. The Returning Officer was not joined as a respondent. The grounds of the petition included allegations that Mr. Caldeira by himself, his agents and other persons on his behalf with his knowledge and consent was guilty of (a) corrupt treating and (b) corrupt bribery, before, during and after the election.

The petition was heard before Mr. Justice K.L. Gordon on the 8th, 9th, and 10th days of November, 1961 and judgement was given on the 21st day of November, 1961.

The Court found that the allegations in the petition and in the particulars which were furnished were not established and dismissed the petition awarding only one-half of his costs to the respondent whose conduct in relation to certain matters was adversely commented upon by the Court. The Court held that Mr. Caldeira was duly elected and certified that determination to the Governor and Speaker.

#### (vi) Electoral District No. 35: Rupununi.

One Charles Niewenkerk presented a petition against the successful candidate Edward Eyre Melville, joining the Returning Officer Neville Leyton Franker as a respondent. The petitioner alleged the commission of corrupt and illegal practices for the purpose of promoting the election of Mr. Melville and that such corrupt and illegal practices so extensively prevailed as may be reasonably supposed to have affected the result of the election; the petitioner further alleged that Mr. Melville was by himself and his agents guilty of treating, undue influence, bribery and certain illegal practices. It was also alleged that the election was not conducted in accordance with the principles laid down in the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957 and such noncompliance may reasonably be supposed to have affected the result of the election. Particulars of the said allegations were supplied by Order of the Court. The allegations in relation to the election not having been conducted in accordance with the principles laid down in the Ordinance were mainly to the effect that presiding officers at 16 of the polling places votes for persons who were not blind or otherwise incapacitated.

The petition was heard before Mr. Justice R.S. Miller on the 3rd, 5th, 6th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th, 22nd and 23rd days of January, 1962. At the close of the petitioner's case, the Return ing Officer was dismissed from the suit with costs to him by the Court, the Court having found that there was no evidence let to support the allegations made in relation to the case against him. The petition proceeded thereafter

as against the first named respondent Mr. Melville. The Court delivered judgement on the 29th day of January, 1962, dismissing the petition with costs, the Judge stating that on consideration of the whole case in all its many and varied aspects, he did not consider the petitioner had presented such a case as enabled him to feel satisfied beyond all doubt, and that the petitioner must be dismissed. The Court held Mr. Melville duly elected and certified this determination to the Governor and the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly accordingly.
