Made Under

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132)

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE
DIRECTOR OF POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS WITH THE
APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Official Inland Correspondence (Amendment) Regulations, 1961, and shall be construed and read with the Official Correspondence Regulations, 1955*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. The second schedule to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion after the item "Superintendents of Police" under the heading "Police" of the following item. —

"Constables in charge of stations".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations extend the category of persons employed in the Police Force who are entitled to frank inland official postal matter to officers of their own department or to other persons upon business connected solely with their public duties and strictly upon Her Majesty's Service.
