THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment No. 5) Order, 1962.

2. The second proviso to the Trade Classification List and Tariff of Part 1 of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance, as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the insertion of the following new items —

	Rate of import duty	
	Preferential tariff	General tariff
(16) Coriander seeds when imported for use in the manufacture of curry powder provided that the Comptroller is satisfied that they will be used solely for that purpose.	50c per 100 lb.	\$1.80 per 100 lb.
(17) Unground black pepper when imported for use in the manufacture of ground black pepper and curry powder provided that the Comptroller is satisfied that it will be used solely for any of the above purposes.	\$3.40 per 100 lb.	\$6.00 per 100 lb.
