THE GOVERNMENT MIARVES ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 263)

UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE GOVERNMENT WHARVES ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING RULES HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR AND APPROVED BY THE LEGISLATURE:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Government Wharves (Public Works Department) Rules, 1962.
- 2. Notwithstending any provision to the contrary contained in any law, no vestel or craft shall be permitted to use any government wharf, under the control of the Public Works Department, unless permis ion shall have been previously obtained from the Director of Public Works or his duly authorised officer, except in the case of accidents, lost of life or perils at sea. Any permission granted in accordance with these Rules shall be subject to the user giving way to vessels and craft of the Public Works Department.
- 3. All cargo lying on any such where or its approaches shall be so packed as to cause no obstruction to traffic or to cause no damage to the superstructure or substructure of the said whare.
- 4. No vessel or craft shall be made fest to any part of any such wharf except to the bollards provided for that purpose.
- 5. No vessel shall lie alongside at or discharge cargo on any portion of any such where other than that appointed by the Director of Public Works or his duly authorised representative.
- 6. All cargo discharged on any such wharf shall be removed immediately upon request of the Director of Public Works or his duly authorised representative by the persont; whom such cargo is consigned or his agent.
- 7. Any person committing a breach of any of these Rules shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty-four dollars.
