


#### **Passengers**

- There were 22,533 more arriving passengers in 2019 when compared to 2018. International Passenger Arrivals for 2019 was 346,753 or 7% higher than 2018.
- Total Passengers travelled were 657,433 compared to 630,143 in 2018. This represents a 4% increase from the corresponding period last year.






#### 2015-2019 INTERNATIONAL ARRIVALS








#### **Visitor Arrivals & Departures by Key Markets**







- Imported cargo for the period under review amounted to 5,509,801 Kgs compared to 5,506,627 Kgs in 2018, an 0.1% increase from the corresponding period last year.
- Exports amounted to 2,748,638 Kgs or a 13% increase over the corresponding period in 2018.
- Total Cargo Processed amounted to 8,258,439 Kgs compared to 7,948,970 Kgs in 2018, an increase of 4%.




#### **CARGO MOVEMENTS (KG)**

#### **Aircraft Movement**

- International Aircraft Landing was 3,644 a increase of 2.13% when compared to 2018.
- Jet Aircraft Landings increase from 3,568 to 3,644. The increase is due mainly to additional flights for Copa & American Airlines
- Turbo Prop and Smaller type aircraft landing reduced from 584 to 573.

### **NEW SERVICES**

### **JetBlue Airways**

- Is expanding its large Latin America and Caribbean network with new nonstop service between New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK) and Cheddi Jagan International Airport (GEO).
- Flights will operate daily on JetBlue's new A321neo aircraft beginning April 2, 2020

#### **Eastern Airlines**

• The Guyana Civil Aviation Authority has given approval for Eastern Airlines to operate regular flights between John F. Kennedy International Airport and Cheddi Jagan International Airport using Boeing 767-200 and 767-300 aircraft.

### **OPERATIONS**

#### **Emergency Exercise**

- In accordance with the ICAO Airport Emergency Planning Manual, Document 9173 Part 7, the Cheddi Jagan International Airport Corporation (CJIAC) staged a Full Scale Emergency Exercise on the 30th October, 2019 on the Aerodrome. The exercise replicated an aircraft accident on airfield based upon a prepared scenario.
- Airports are required to regularly conduct exercises to test their emergency plans, procedures, equipment, communications and the response of key personnel.
- The exercise involved persons from key agencies such as the Cheddi Jagan International Airport Corporation, Guyana Defence Force, Guyana Police Force, Airport Fire Service, Airport Security Unit, Civil Defence Commission, Customs, Immigration, Ministry of Public Health and the Guyana Civil Aviation Authority (Air Navigation Services).




# Over **5,340 students** from **64 schools** visited the airport during 2019.
