Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud: Cde. Speaker, I wrote you this morning indicating my intention to move, as a matter of definite urgent public importance, the fact that article 52 of the Constitution makes provision for the office of Ombudsman, would be there for them to do so.

My information is that the term of office of the former holder has expired and it has not been renewed and so far as the Gazette is concerned, no appointment has been published.

Many people who wish to write the Ombudsman have been calling on the Opposition because they wish to make complaint, they wish to air their grievances but they are prevented from doing so because the Ombudsman is not there.

This office, as you know, Cde. Speaker, come to us with Independence. The importance of it cannot be overstressed. We are all aware of it and I think this is the proper time and forum to ask you, sir, to consider that this matter is an urgent question seeing that people are involved and no action is taken get the Assembly to air its views on the matter with the precise and definite objective of having the Ombudsman re-appointed or a new one appointed without the delay.

The Speaker: Comrades and hon. Members, for a matter to qualify under this head, it must be of recent occurrence and raised without delay, as well as it must be raised at the earliest possible opportunity, if not, it fails in urgency. Under both heads, this Motion does not qualify. I regret, therefore, that I am unable to allow it.
