Presentation and First Reading

(1) PENSIONS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 - Bill No. 4/1975 published 21.1.75

The Minister of Finance, on behalf of the Prime Minister, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE FENSIONS ACT.

(2) MINERS ASSISTANCE BILL 1975 - Bill No. 5/1975

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, on behalf of the Minister of Energy and Matural Resources, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MINERS ASSISTANCE FUND TO AID MINERS IN THE ORDERLY AND EFFECTIVE EXTRACTION OF VALUABLE MINERALS.

BILL - Second and Third Readings

TEACHING SERVICE COMMISSION BILL 1974 - Bill No. 43/1974 published 28.12.74

The Minister of Education and Social Development moved the second reading of the following Bill:

Mrs. Da Silva spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Education and Social Development replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

<u>In Committee</u>

Clause 1: The Chairman requested that "1975" be substituted for "1974" in Clause 1 and wheregver it appeared in the Bill.

Clause 1 was then passed as corrected.

- <u>Clause 2:</u> The following amendments by the Minister of Education and Social Development were put and carried:
 - (a) <u>Insertion</u> of the word "a" immediately after the word "be" in paragraph (b) in the definition of the expression "qovernment school".
 - (b) <u>Substitution</u> of the following para⇒ graph for paragraph (d) ⇒
 - "(d) any other school or other place of education established and maintained wholly out of monies provided by Parliament as may be specified as being included in the expression for the purposes of this Act by the Minister by order;".

Clause 2 was then passed as amended.

- Clause 3: The following amendments by Mrs. Da Silva were put and negatived:
 - (a) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "with the Leader of the Opposition and" between the word "consulted" and the word "with" in subsection (2)(a).
 - (b) Addition of the words "after consultation with the Leader of the Oppusition" after the words "Prime Minister" in subsection (2)(e).
 - (c) Addition of the words "after consultation with the Leader of the Opposition" after the words "Prime Minister" in subsection (4).

Clause 3 was then passed as printed.

Clauses 4 to 11 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 12:</u> The following amendment by the Leader of the Opposition was put and <u>negatived:</u>

<u>Substitution</u> of the words "affirmative resolution" for the words "negative resolution" in subsection (1).

Clause 12 was then passed as printed.

<u>Clause 13:</u> (1) The following amendment by Mrs. DaSilva was put and <u>negatived:</u>

<u>Deletion</u> of subsection 2(c) and <u>substitution</u> of the following therefor:

- "(c) with the concurrence of the governing body, appoint an applicant to fill the vacancy notwithstanding that there is no agreement between the Commission and the governing body on the list compiled by the governing body."
- (2) The following amendmente by the Minister of Education and Social Development were put and <u>carried</u>:
 - (a) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "to fill the vacancy" immediately after the word "teacher" in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2);
 - (b) <u>Substitution</u> of a full stop for the semi-colon after the word "list" at the end of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) and <u>deletion</u> of all the words following thereafter in that subsection; and
 - (c) <u>Insertion</u> of the following subsection as subsection (3) of the section -
 - "(3) Where the Commission and the governing body have failed to reach agreement on the list compiled by the governing body the Commission may, after consultation with the governing body, appoint an applicant to fill the vecancy.".

Clause 13 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 14 to 16 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 17:</u> The following amendment by the Minister of Education and Social Development was put and <u>carried:</u>

<u>Substitution</u> of the word "Minister" for the word "President" in subsection (1).

Clauses 18 to 23 were passed as printed.

The First, Second and Third Schedules were passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Education and Social Development the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u> in Committee.

MOTION

ITEM 2 - GUARANTEE OF CREDITS TO GUYANA RICE BOARD

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion:

WHEREAS the Guyana Rice Board requires overdraft facilities of up to thirty-five million dollars to carry out its functions properly;

AND WHEREAS the Guyana National Co-operative Bank, the Royal Bank of Canada and Barclays Bank. International Limited, are prepared to enter into Agreements with the Loard to provide overdraft facilities not exceeding the sum of \$35 million provided the credits are guaranteed by the Government of Guyana:

DE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly authorises the Minister of Finance or such other person duly authorised by him, acting on behalf of the Government of Guyana, to enter into Agreements as guarantor to the Guyana National Cooperative Bank, the Royal Bank of Canada and Barclays Bank International Limited for the purpose of guaranteeing credits by way of overdraft facilities to the Guyana Rice Board amounting in the aggregate to \$35 million.

The Leader of the Upposition spoke to the motion.

The Minister of Finance replied.

Thereafter the motion was put and <u>carried</u>.
