QUESTIONS TO MINISTERS

Question No. 5

<u>Cdc. Ally</u> asked the Minister of agriculture the following question:

QUESTION: Will the Minister of Agriculture confirm that rice received at the Springlands Bond of the Rice Marketing Board is blended and that shipments made to overseas markets are effected from that point?

If so, will the Minister say why farmers are made to pay freight to Georgetown.

The Minister of Agriculture gave the following reply:

ANSWER: Prior to June 1975 rice received at the Corriverton Bond of the Guyana Rice Board was blendod and shipped to Georgetown. Since then, rice received at Corrivorton is blended and approximately half is shipped to Georgetown and half exported directly to the Caribbean.

> The freight charge paid by farmers from Corriverton to Georgeteun was instituted since the early 1960's, the rationale being to offset the cost of transportation from Corrivorton to Georgeteun. A freight charge is still payable by farmers, but it is subsidised by the Board. Thus, although the actual cost to the Board of transporting a bag of rice is 75 cents, the farmer pays the Board 48 cents per bag only. The difference or subsidy of 27 cents per bag is absorbed by the Board.

Supplementary questions were asked by Cdes. Ally and Reepu Daman Persoud.

<u>Cec. Ally</u> asked the Minister of Works and Housing the following question:

QUESTION: Will the Minister of Works and Housing say what was the amount voted for the completion of the Crabwood Creek-Orealla Road, how much has been spent, and why work has ceased on the road?

The Minister of Works and Housing gave the following reply:

INSWER:

 (a) Works on the Crabwood Creek/Orealla Road
Project commenced in 1973, Expenditure on the project to date is as follows:-

- (b) The length of the road is approximately 40 miles. From the Orealla and 12 miles, and from the Crabwood Creek and ¼ mile have been completed to half of base level. Also compounds have been established at both ends. At the Orealla end the road has opened up large areas of agriculture, and forest lands previously inaccessible.
- (c) It is estimated that \$10,000,000 would be required to complete the road.
- (d) Work on the road was discontinued because of more pressing priorities.

Item 1 EST/ BLISHMENT OF HOUSING SCHEME WAT PLANTATION HOPE

Cde. Janet Jagan moved and Cde. Belgrave seconded the following motion:

WHEREAS conditions at Plantation Hope are deplorable with some 70 family units living under the most primitive conditions without pure water, sonitation or electricity and in houses unfit for human habitation:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly recommends to the Government that immediate steps be taken to establish a proper housing scheme for the inhabitants of Plantation Hope, East Coast, Demerare.

Mrs Da Silva and the Minister of Works and Housing spoke to the motion.

Cde. Janet Jagan replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

Item 2 SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER NO. 23 (3)

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That Standing Order No. 23(3) be suspended to enable the Assembly to proceed at its sitting on Wednesday, 24th November, 1976, with the motion submitted by Cde. J.R. Thomas, notice of which was published on 19th November, 1976, on Notice Paper No. 84.

The Leader of the Opposition spoke to the motion.

The motion was then put and carried.

Item 3 SABOTAGE OF CUBANA FLIGHT NO. 455

Cde. Thomas moved and Cde. Jaiserrisingh seconded the following motion:

WHEREAS the People of Guyana have asserted their permanent sovereignty over their natural resources and have taken effective control of their economy so as to ensure rapid social and economic development;

AND WHERE.S the programme of social and economic reconstruction which is now being implemented has attracted hostility and opposition;

...ND WHEREAS the pursuit of an independent foreign policy is the indisputable right of a sovereign nation;

AND HEREAS acts of terrorism designed to frustrate the will of the people of Guyana and of other sister Caribbean States embarked on similar programmes have been perpetrated;

AND WHEREAS the latest act of terrorism in this campaign to frustrate the processes of self-determination has been the sabotage of Cubana flight No. 455 on Wednesday, October 6th with the consequent loss of seventy-three lives including Cubans, Koreans and Guyanese:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly -

Records its profound abhorrence of the wantom murder of seventy-three innocent persons including eleven of our Guyanese comrades;

Directs that an appropriate expression of its shock and sorrow be conveyed to the relatives of these Guyanese martyrs;

Further directs that similar sentiments be conveyed to the Government of the Republic of Cuba and the Government of the People's Republic of Korea and through them to the relatives of their martyrs;

Condomns these despicable acts of sabotage and terrorism and reaffirms its commitment to work with all States, agencies and institutions to eradicate this regime of terror; Reaffirms the sovereign right of each State to pursue the paths of development of its choice free from interference of any kind in its internal affairs or in its relations with other States.

Mrs. Do Silva, Mr. Singh and the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Justice spoke to the motion.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.10 p.m. the sitting was suspended for refreshments.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 6.00 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Assembly resumed the debate on the motion by Cde. Thomas.

The Leader of the Opposition spoke to the motion and moved the following amendment:

The addition of the following at the end of the motion:

"And gives unequivocal support to all the states in the Caribbean which are fighting against colonialism, neo-colonialism and imperialism, and also to the Cuban Government in its decision to renounce the agreement with the U.S. Government on air and maritime piracy and other crimes."

Cde, Mohamed seconded the amendment,

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House moved the following amendment:

The addition of the following at the end of the motion:

"And gives unequivocal support to the Cuban Government and to the people and Governments of other progressive countries of the Caribbean for whatever appropriate action they deem necessary to defend their states from further acts of aggression and terrorism aimed at their sovereignty and independence."

The Minister of Information and $\ensuremath{\mathbb{C}}$ ulture seconded the amendment.

The Prime Minister spoke.

The amendment by the Leader of the Opposition was put and <u>negatived</u> on the following division:
