 - (a) In the proposed paragraph (2) (a) (i) of regulation 7, the words "or the Director of Public Prosections" were <u>inserted</u> immediately after the word "Judicature";
 - (b) In the proposed paragraph (2) (a) (ii) of regulation 7, the words", the Director of Public Prosecutions," were <u>deleted</u>.

Clause 9 was then passed as amended.
