REPLIES TO QUESTIONS

Mr. Roth on behalf of Mr. Lee asked the Colonial Secretary the following questions:-

- 1. Will Government state whether the Local Government Board has its own Auditor to audit the Local ...uthorities' books?
- 2. If the answer is in the affirmative, will Government state whether it is possible to get the accounts of the Local Authorities audited by the Audit Department?
- 3. Will Government state how many Local and Village Authorities' accounts have been audited by the Audit Department, and if any adverse reports were made to the Local Government Board?
- 4. Name the Local and/or Village Authorities and lay the reports on the table, if any.

With Council's consent the following replies by the Colonial Secretary which were printed and laid were taken as read:-

- 1. The Local Government Board has no Auditor at the present time. Some years ago an additional post of Class I Officer was assigned to the Headquarters Staff of the Department of Local Government for the purpose of auditing the books and accounts of Local Authorities, but the pressure of work in the Department has made it impossible for an officer to remain allotted solely to those duties as intended. The current practice is for the books and accounts of the Local Authorities to be audited by the staffs of the District Commissioners in their respective districts.
- 2. There are ninety-one Local Authorities and the Audit Department is not in a position to take on the work of auditing their accounts without a considerable increase in staff and travelling expenses.
- 3. & 4. In view of the reply to Question 2, these questions do not arise. (M.P. 31/37).
