BILL - Second Reading and Committee.

Item 1 - RENT RESTRICTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1958 - Bill No. 14/1958.

The Minister of Labour, Health and Housing moved and the Minister of Community Development and Education seconded that the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE RENT RESTRICTION ORDINANCE be read a second time.

After discussion, the question was put and Council divided and voted thereon as follows:-

Motion affirmed.

The Bill was then read a second time.

On a motion by the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing, Council resolved itself into a Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clause 1 - Short Title - was passed as printed.

In Committee (contd.)

Clause 2 -

- The Minister of Labour, Health and Housing moved the deletion of the printed Clause 2, and the substitution of the following therefor:-

"2. (1) Subsection (4) of section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

(2) Where an agreement in respect of a tenancy for a period of five years or upwards has been made before the enactment of this Ordinance and the agreement includes a provision requiring the payment of any fine, premium, or other like sum, or the giving of any consideration in addition to the rent which could lawfully have been required prior to the enactment of this Ordinance, such provision shall cease to have effect."

Mr. Fredericks moved the following amendment to the new clause proposed by the Minister:-

Deletion of subsection (1) and substitution therefor of the following:-

'2.(1) Subsection (4) of section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by the deletion of the full stop at the end of the subsection and the addition of the following words "in excess of seven hundred and twenty dollars per annum."

In order to afford the Attorney-General an opportunity of considering certain points raised by Mr. Burnham and the amendment moved by Mr. Fredericks, the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing moved that the Chairman do report progress and ask leave to sit again.

The question was put and carried.

Council resumed.

MOTIONS

Item 2 - MOTION CONCERNING CENTENARY EXHIBITIONS.

On a motion by the Minister of Community Development and Education (Mr. Benn) seconded by the Minister of Natural Resources, (Mr. Beharry), Council adopted the following Resolution:-

RESOLVED, That this Council varies the terms of Resolution No. XI of 1932 passed by the Legislative Council on the 24th of March 1933 to enable Centenary Exhibitions to be tenable at any Government or aided Secondary School and for fees not exceeding \$30.00 per term for a school year of three terms to be paid with respect to each exhibitioner.

Item 3 4 MR, BURNHAM'S MOTION CONCERNING AID TO PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

Council resumed the debate on the following motion:-

That this Council recommends to Government that the policy with respect to aid to Private Secondary Schools be reviewed immediately. After certain Members had spoken, the question was put and Council divided and voted thereon as follows:-
