INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

Presentation and First Reading

ELECTION LAWS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1991 - Bill No. 6/1991

The Accorney General and Minister of Legal Affairs, on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

In accordance with article 171(2) of the Constitution the Minister of Finance signified that Cabinet had recommended that the National Assembly should proceed upon the motion for the approval of the Estimates of Expenditure for the Financial Year 1991.

The Minister of Finance then moved the motion for the approval of the estimates of expenditure for the Financial year 1991 of a total sum \$16,688,916,000 excluding \$12,737,415,000 which is chargeable by law (See APPENDIX).

The Minister read the Budget Speech and thereafter named Monday 25th February, 1991 as the day for the resumption of the debate on the motion.

ITEM 2 - EXPULSION OF CUE. ISAHAK BASIR, M.P.

The Minister of regional Development indicated that he would not proceed with the above item at that sitting.

The Speaker observed that it was desirable for Cae. Basir to receive a copy of a motion of an amendment to the notice by the Minister of Regional Development before the Assembly proceeded upon the motion. He instructed the Cherk to send a copy of the amendment to Cae. Basir.

MOTION BY THE MINISTER OF FINANCE

WHEREAS the Constitution of Guyana requires that estimates of the revenues and expenditure of Guyana for any financial year should be laid before the National Assembly;

AND WHEREAS the Constitution also provides that when the estimates of expenditure have been approved by the Assembly an Appropriation Bill shall be introduced in the Assembly providing for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet that expenditure;

AND WHEREAS estimates of revenues and expenditure of Guyana for the financial year 1991 have been prepared and laid before the Assembly on 1991-02-20;

NOW. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly approves the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1991, of a total sum of sixteen billion, six hundred and eighty eight million, sixteen hundred and nine thousand dollars (\$16,688,916,000), excluding twelve billion, hundred and thirty seven million, four hundred and fifteen thousand dollars (\$12,737,415,000) which is chargeable by law, as detailed therein and summarized in the undermentioned schedule, and agree that it is expedient to amend the law and to make further provision in respect to finance.
