#### GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

#### BILL - First Reading.

MUNICIPAL COUNCILS (POSTPONEMEN OF ELECTIONS) BILL, 1954 - Bill No. 52/1954.

On a motion by the Member for Local Government, Social Welfare and Co-operative Develo ment seconded by Mr. Gajraj the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE POST-PONEMENT OF ELECTIONS TO THE TOWN COUNCILS OF GEORGETOWN AND NEW AMSTERDAM AND FOR PURPOSES CONNECTED THEREWITH was read a first time.

#### MOTIONS

APPROVING RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN PROFESSOR RICHARDSON'S REPORT ON SOCIAL SECURITY IN BRITISH GUIANA.

Council resumed the deba e on the following motion and amendment:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Honourable Council accepts in principle the recommendations contained in Professor Richardson's Report on Social Security in British Guiana and approves of the proposals of the Gov rnor in Council on those recommendations as set out in paragraph 34 of Sessional Paper No. 10 of 1954.

#### Amendment:

Substitution of a semi-colon for the full stop at the end of the motion and the addition of the following words:

"and that this Council records its grateful thanks to Professor Richardson for his valuable Report."

After discussion the motion as amended was put and carried.

### INCREASE IN OLD AGE PENSIONS

On a motion by the Member for Local Government, Social Welfare and Co-operative Development seconded by Mr. Gajraj, Council adopted the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, That the amount of pension payable under and in accordance with the provisions of the Old Age Pensions Ordinance, 1944, as fixed in subsection (1) of section 8 of the said Ordinance shall, with effect from the 1st day of July, 1954, be varied -

- (a) in the case of a person ordinarily resident in the Georgetown area from four dollars and fifty cents per mensem to seven dollars and fifty cents per mensem; and
- (b) in the case of a person ordinarily resident elsewhere than in the Georgetown area from three dollars per mensem to five dollars and fifty cents per mensem:

AND FURTHER RESOLVED, That Resolution No. XXVIII passed by the Legislative Council on the 9th day of March, 951, be annulled with effect from the 1st day of July, 1954.

# RENT RESTRICTION (CONTINUANCE)(AMENDMENT) BILL. 1954 - Bill No. 48/1954.

On motions by the Member for Labour, Health and Housing seconded by the Attorney General the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE RENT RESTRICTION (CONTINUANCE) ORDINANCE, 1954 was read a second time and was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed with the following amendment in Committee:-

Clause 2: Proviso - Substitution of the word "fifteenth" for the word "thirteenth" in the fourth line.

# SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (19 3) (No. 2) BILL, 1954 - Bill No. 49/1954.

On motions by the Financ al Secretary seconded by the Attorney General the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO ALLOW AND CONFIRM CERTAIN ADDIT ONAL EXPENDITURE INCURRED IN THE YEAR ENDED THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, 1953, was read a second time and was hereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed as printed.

## FACTORIES (AMENDMENT) BILL. 1954 - Bill No. 51/1954.

On motions by the Member for Labour, Health and , Housing seconded by Mr. Ramphal the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE FURTHER TO AMEND THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE, 1947, was read a second time and was hereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed as printed.
