BE IT RESOLVED:

That section 56(3) of Ordinance No. 31 of 1956, Rice Farmers (Security of Tenure) Ordinance, 1956, be repealed. (Notice was given on 29th November, 1956).

5. Mr. Luckhoo to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the tenants of lands at Ruimveldt and Alexander Village are suffering great hardship since they cannot freely sell, repair or sublet their own houses; and

That this House respectfully recommends to Government that Government should either forthwith rehouse the tenants as was undertaken to be done by Government, or take the necessary steps to have the Ruimveldt and Alexander Village areas excluded from the Industrial Zone in the Greater Georgetown Plan.
