ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, (No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTION 15 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Encephalitic Condition of Livestock) Order, 1953.

In this Order —

"livestock" shall not include poultry.

3. Owing to the presence therein of cases of a suspected communicable encephalitic condition of livestock, the area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be, for the purposes of the above-mentioned Ordinance, an area suspected to be infected with a communidable encephalitic condition of livestock.

SCHEDULE (Description of Area).

That area, bounded on the North and East by the Atlantic Ocean, on the South by the Supernaam River and on the West by the Pomeroon River and an imaginary line joining the source of the Pomeroon River to the source of the Supernaam River.
