THE AMERINDIAN ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 58).

UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE AMERINDIAN ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Amerindian Village (St. Francis) Order, 1964.
- 2. The portion of the Colony described in the schedule hereto is hereby declared to be an Amerindian Village.

SCHEDULE

St. Francis Amerindian Village

The area commencing at the junction of the Mahaicony River and the Francois River and extending thence in a south-westerly direction along the watershed between the Captain River and the Francois River for a distance of about 15 miles to the boundary between the Counties of Demerara and Berbice, thence in a easterly direction along the said boundary to the boundary between the East Demerara and West Berbice Administrative Districts, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary between the East Demerara and West Berbice Administrative Districts for about 11½ miles, thence in a north-westerly direction to the point of commencement, and containing approximately 52,000 acres.
