PROCLAMATION



By His Excellency Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, upon whom has been conferred the Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of British Guiana, Vice-Admiral of the same. etc., etc., etc.,

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 11 of the Income Tax Ordinance, Chapter 299, that the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Gazette, provide that the interest payable on any loan charged on the public revenue of the Colony shall be exempted from the tax, either generally or only in respect of interest payable to persons not resident in the Colony; and that such interest as from the date and to the extent specified in the proclamation shall be exempt accordingly:

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the provisions aforesaid, I do hereby declare and provide that the interest on the Government of British Guiana 7% Debentures, 1965/1975, of the loan issue of eight million dollars authorised by the Public Loan Ordinance, 1965, payable to persons not resident in the Colony, shall from the date of issue of such debentures be exempted from income tax.
