
BRITISH GUIANA

PROCLAMATION



By His Excellency Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT,
Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George,
Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian
Order, upon whom has been conferred the
Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and
Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of
British Guiana, Vice-Admiral of the same,
etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 4(1) of the Guyana Independence Order 1966 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") that where the Governor-General has power by or under the Order to do anything for the purposes thereof, such power may be exercised by the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of British Guiana at any time after the making of the Order to such extent as may, in his opinion, be necessary or expedient to enable the Constitution of Guyana set out in Schedule 2 to the Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Constitution") to function as from the 26th May, 1966;

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General has power under article 81(1) of the Constitution to appoint by proclamation the place within Guyana at which each session of the Parliament of Guyana shall be held and the time when it shall begin:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of section 4 of the Order and article 81(1) of the Constitution, and by virtue and in exercise of all powers thereunto enabling me, I do hereby proclaim that a session of the Parliament of Guyana shall be held in the Parliament Chamber at the Public Buildings, Georgetown. Guyana, and shall begin at 11 o'clock in the forenoon on Thursday the 26th May, 1966.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Government House, British Guiana, this 17th day of May, 1966, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
