And further, We do hereby appoint that, so soon as you Termination shall have taken the prescribed oaths and have entered upon the of Commissions dated duties of your office, this Our present Commission shall supersede 16th May, Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the 1966, and 31st October, sixteenth day of May, 1966, appointing Aur Trusty and Well-beloved 1966. Sir Richard Edmonds Luyt, Knight Commander (now Knight Grand Cross) of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of Our Royal Victorian Order, upon whom has been conferred Our Distinguished Conduct Medal, to be Our Governor-General of Guyana, and the Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the thirty-first day of October, 1966, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved The Honourable Sir Kenneth Sievewright Stoby, Knight, to perform the functions of the Office of Governor-General of Guyana.

III. And We hereby command all and singular Our Officers Officers, etc. and loving subjects in Guyana and all others whom it may concern to give obedience. to take due notice hereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.
