## REGULATIONS

## MADE UNDER

THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 — 1963

UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL 1939-1963, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amendment) (No. 6) Regulations, 1964, and shall be construed and read with the Emergency Powers Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

Amendment of Regulation

- 2. Regulation 68 of the Principal Regulations (as substituted by Regulation 4 of the Emergency Powers (Amendment) Regulations, 1964 and further amended by Regulation 7 of the Emergency Powers (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1964) is hereby amended as follows —
- (a) in paragraph (1)
  - (i) by the deletion of the words "The Governor may in his discretion" and the substitution therefor of the following—
    " The Competent Authority may, subject to any such directions or instructions as the Governor may in his discretion give or issue to him,"
  - (ii) by the deletion from sub-paragraph (a) of the word "acquire" and the substitution therefor of the following subject to the prior approval of the Governor acquire ":
- (b) in paragraph (2) by the deletion of the words "The Governor acting in pursuance of this regulation may" and the substitution therefor of the following
  - The Competent Authority acting in pursuance of this regulation may, subject to the prior approval of the Governor, ";
- (c) in paragraph (4) by the deletion of the word "Governor" wherever it appears therein and the substitution therefor of the following
  - " Competent Authority ".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations further amend the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964 by revesting in the Competent Authority the duty to take measures for the relief of persons who are the victims of acts of violence in the Emergency.
