BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 42 OF 1951.

An Ordinance further to amend the Teachers Pensions Ordinance with respect to the rate of pension and the Teachers Pension Register.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the A.D. 1951. advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Teachers Pensions Short Title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Teachers Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter referred Cap. 197 to as the Principal Ordinance.

6. The provisions of the Principal Ordinance, and of sections Application two to five inclusive of this Ordinance shall apply —

(a) to every teacher whose name is entered in the Teachers Pension Register subsequent to the coming into effect of this Ordinance: and

(b) to every teacher whose name was in the Teachers Pension Register on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and forty-four, unless he intimates in writing to the Director of Education on or before the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-two that he desires that the provisions of sections three, three A, five or five A of the Principal Ordinance, as the case may be, shall continue to apply to him; and

(c) to every teacher whose name was in the Teachers Pension Register on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and forty-three, and who retired as a teacher or from the public service of the Colony on or after the first day of January, nineteen hundred and forty-four, and who intimates in writing to the Director of Education on or before the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-two, that he desires that the provisions of the Principal Ordinance and of this Ordinance shall apply to him.

8. The Principal Ordinance is hereby further amended by the addition thereto of the following Schedule —

"SCHEDULE

Section 15 (4)

Regulations as to the qualifications and conditions subject to which entries may be made in the Teachers Pension Register.

1. The Teachers Pension Register shall be divided into two parts, namely, Part I relating to certificated teachers,

and Part II relating to uncertificated teachers.

2. (1) The name of every certificated teacher who has been examined by a Medical Board and certified to be physically fit for service as a teacher and who has served in a school or schools for 3 consecutive years as a certificated teacher, shall be entered in the Teachers Pension Register.

(2) The name of every uncertificated teacher who has served in a school or schools for 10 consecutive years to the satisfaction of the Director, shall be entered in the Teachers

Pension Register.

(3) Where an uncertificated teacher whose name is entered as such in the Teachers Pension Register becomes a certificated teacher, his name shall forthwith thereafter be entered as a certificated teacher in the Teachers Pension Register.

3. The Director shall remove from the Teachers Pension

Register —

(a) the name of any teacher who has died;

(b) the name of any teacher whose certificate has been cancelled;

(c) the name of any teacher who has ceased, for a period of more than 5 years, to be employed as a teacher in schools of the Colony;

Provided that the name of a teacher shall not be removed under this paragraph where such teacher has

been appointed to a pensionable office as defined in section 2 of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933.

4. Where the name of a teacher has been removed from the Teachers Pension Register under paragraph 3 (c) hereof, his name shall not be re-entered in the Register until he has, subsequent to the date of such removal, complied with the provisions of paragraph 2 (1) or paragraph 2 (2) hereof

as the case may be.

5. Where the Director refuses to enter or re-enter the name of a teacher in the Teachers Pension Register, or where he removed the name of a teacher from the Teachers Pension Register, such teacher may appeal to the Governor in Council from the decision of the Director, and the decision of the Governor in Council shall be final.

6. The names of all teachers entered in the Teachers Pension Register on the date this schedule comes into force shall, subject to the provisions of paragraphs 2 (3), 3, 4 and

5 hereof, remain therein.

7. There shall be entered in the Teachers Pension Register the period or periods of the service for pension of every teacher whose name is entered therein, and the school or schools in which the teacher served for any such period or periods.

8. These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers Pension

Regulations, 1951."
