## BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 46 OF 1951.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Customs Duties Ordin- A.D. 1951. ance, 1935.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows: -

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment No. 4) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1935, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

(2) The appropriate rates of duty set forth in subsection (1) of this section shall be charged levied and paid in respect of

the goods therein specified —

(a) where prior to the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fifty-one any such goods were entered for consumption in the Colony but the duties payable in respect of such goods were not paid or secured prior to such date; or

(b) where on or after the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fifty-one any such goods are entered for consumption in the

Colony.
