BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 48 of 1951.

An Ordinance further to amend the Tax Ordinance, 1939.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with A.D. 1951. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tax (Amendment No. 4) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Tax Ordinance, 1939, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

Repeal and re-enactment of section 38 of the

2. Section thirty-eight of the Principal Ordinance is here repealed and the following substituted therefor —

THE LAWS OF BRITISH GUIANA.

"Liquor 38. Every person who —

Store (a) in the city of Georgetown or the town of Ne Licence Amsterdam or within one mile of the bou daries of such city or town or in such other are as may be permitted under the provisions any Ordinance for the time being in force regulating the storage, sale and disposal spirituous liquors —

> (i) stores in bulk, mixes and blends spirituliquor in a liquor store and sells delivers therefrom spirituous liquor, winor malt liquor, shall take out an annua licence for so doing, and shall pay for the same the sum of four hundred dollars:

(ii) keeps and sells or delivers from a liquor store spirituous liquor, wine or malt liquor, but does not store in bulk, mix or blend such spirituous liquor, shall tak out an annual licence for so doing, an shall pay for the same the sum of two hundred and twenty-five dollars;

(b) imports and sells spirits in bond in the cit of Georgetown or the town of New Amsterdar shall take out an annual licence for so doir and shall pay for the same the sum of the hundred dollars:

Provided that the holder of a liquor store licence issued under paragraph (a) of this section shall not be required to take out a further licence to import and sell spirits in bond."

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.
