ORDINANCE No. 45 OF 1954

An Ordinance to provide that all Government currency notes which are legal tender in the Island of Jamaica shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in British Guiana

[25th December, 1954]

ENACTED by the Legislature of British Guiana: —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Legal Tender (Jamaica Currency Notes) Ordinance, 1954.

2. (1) All currency notes which, by virtue of the Currency Notes Law of the Island of Jamaica, are legal tender in that Island, are hereby declared to be legal tender for the payment of any amount in this Colony.

(2) For the purposes of this section the value of currency notes provided, issued or re-issued under the Currency Notes Law of the Island of Jamaica shall be calculated at the rate of one pound for four dollars and eighty cents.

3. This Ordinance shall come into operation on such date as the Governor shall fix by proclamation published in the Gazette.
