An Ordinance to validate the election of certain councillors of the Buxton and Friendship Village District and all proceedings of the Village Council of that district in which those councillors have acted, and all acts done by such persons as councillors of that village council.

Validation of rights, powers, acts and duties exercised and undertaken

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:— 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government (Buxton and Friendship Village Council Election and Acts)

Validation Ordinance, 1954.

2. In this Ordinance — "specified period" means the period commencing on the 6th April, 1952, and terminating upon the commencement of this Ordinance.

The election of every councillor of the Buxton and Friendship Village Council during the specified period shall be, and is hereby declared to be, as valid from the date of his election as if the Order of the Governor in Council in relation to the said village district made on the 8th August, 1935, under the provisions of subsection (12) of section 2 of the Local Government (Village Councils) Ordinance, 1935, and published in the Gazette of the 10th August, 1935, continued in force and was of full effect up

to and during the specified period.

All proceedings of the Buxton and Friendship Village Council in which any person to whom the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance apply in respect of his election or purported election as a councillor of that Village Council during the specified period has acted, and all rights, powers, acts and duties exercised and undertaken, or purported to have been exercised or undertaken by such person as a councillor of such village council during the specified period, shall be deemed to have been duly exercised and undertaken and are hereby declared to be good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
