## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 3 OF 1955.

An Ordinance further to amend the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance by making provision for town constables to be appointed to bear the titles of superintendent, assistant superintendent, sergeant and corporal.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1955

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Town Short title Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be construed and read as one with the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, Cap. 85 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any other Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section one hundred and fifteen of the Principal Ordin- Amendance is hereby amended —

(a) by renumbering the section as subsection (1); and section 115 (b) by the addition of the following subsection —

"(2) The Council may appoint any such town constable to bear the title of Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Sergeant or Corporal, as the case may be."

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein after section one hundred and twenty-four of the following new section —

"Right of Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Sergeant and Corporal to prosecute cases.

124A. Where a town constable lays an information or makes a complaint against any person in respect of any offence against the provisions of this Ordinance or of any by-laws in force thereunder, any town constable appointed to bear the title of Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Sergeant or Corporal may appear before the magistrate who is trying or enquiring into the matter of the information or complaint and shall have the same privileges as to addressing the magistrate and examining the witnesses adduced in the matter as the town constable who laid the information or made the complaint would have had."
