BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. .21 OF 1955

An Ordinance to extend the provisions of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, and of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, to officers transferred to other public service who elect within a specified period that the aforesaid provisions shall apply to them.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Transferred Officers) (Exercise of Option) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be construed and read as one with the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance and any Ordinance amending the same.

The provisions of the Principal Ordinance and of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance. 1944. to apply to transferred officers who elect at the time of their retirement. No. 39 of 1944. No. 42 of 1950. No. 51 of

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (II) of section 21 of the Principal Ordinance, of paragraph (b) of subsection (i) of section 6 of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and of section 4 of the Pensions (Amendment No. 3) Ordinance, 1950, as substituted by section 3 of the Pensions (Amendment No. 4) Ordinance, 1950, the Principal Ordinance and the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, shall apply to any officer who was in the public service of the Colony prior to the 22nd December, 1944, and was transferred to other public service and retired from such public service prior to the 7th October, 1950, and who, not later than twelve months after the commencement of this Ordinance intimates in writing to the Chief Secretary that he desires that the provisions of the Principal Ordinance and of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, shall apply to him.

Passed by the Legislative Council this thirteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-five.
