



## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 36 OF 1933.

An Ordinance to amend the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance with respect to the borrowing powers of the Council.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the New Amsterdam Town Short Title. Council Ordinance (No. 2), 1933, and shall be construed with the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance, hereinafter referred to Cap. 87. as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Repeal and re-enactment of sec. 146 of Cap. 87. No. 6 of 1933. 2. Section one hundred and forty-six of the Principal Ordinance as enacted by section three of the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance, 1933, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

Short term leases. "146. The Council may from time to time borrow in any one year from the Council's bankers sums of money not exceeding at any time during the year twenty-thousand dollars and any money so borrowed shall be employed in the payment of any votes on the annual and supplementary estimates for that year: provided that the Council's indebtedness in respect of such borrowings shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars."

Passed by the Legislative Council this 7th day of December, 1933.
