A BILL

Intituled

AN ACT to amend the Legal Practitioners Act and to provide for incidental matters.

A.D. 1974 Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short litle. Cap. 4:01

This Act, which amends the Legal Practitioners Act, 1. may be cited as the Legal Practitioners (Amendment) Act 1974.

Insertion of section 44 in the Principal Act.

The Principal Act is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 43 of the following section -

- Rights as to practice as tate Solicitor or Deputy State Solicitor.

 State Solicitor or the number of discharging the functions of that therein, he shall be entitled to practise as a solicitor for the purpose of dischanging the functions of that office and any such barrister shall, when acting in the capacity of State Solicitor, be deemed to be a solicitor for the purposes of any law.
 - (2) The provisions of subsection (1) shall, as they apply to the office of State Solicitor, app'y mutatis mutandis to the office of Deputy State So'icitor.".

Repeal and re-enact-ment of section 36 of Chapter 2:01

3. Section 36 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Act is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor -

"Functions of of Deputy State Solicitor shall have and may exercise and perform all the functions in respect of the offices of the State Solicitor.

"Functions of the State Solicitor shall have and may exercise and perform all the functions in respect of the offices of the State Solicitor. exerc'se and perform all the functions in respect of the offices of the State Solicitor, Official Receiver and Public Trustee as are conferred or imposed by any law.".

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Clause 2 of the Bill seeks to amend the Legal Practitioners Act, Chap er 4:01, to enable a barr.ster, if appointed as State So'icitor, or Deputy State Solicitor to discharge the functions thereof.

Clause 3 of the Bill seeks to empower the Deputy tate Solicitor to deput.se for the Official Receiver and Public Trustee in like manner as he now deputises for the State Solicitor.
