AN ACT to amend the Legal Practitioners Act.

A.D. 1975. Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short title. Cap. 4:01. 1. This Act, which amends the Legal Practitioners Act, may be cited as the Legal Practitioners (Amendment) Act 1975.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to amend the Legal Practitioners Act, Cap. 4:01, for the purpose of enabling persons holding the Legal Education Certificate of the Council of Legal Education of the Commonwealth Caribbean to be admitted to practise in the courts of Guyana either as barristers or as solicitors, as they may elect. Provision is made in clause 4 of the Bill to enable a person to change his practice as a legal practitioner.

In addition, clause 8 of the Bill seeks to confer upon a legal practitioner against whom an order has been made by the High Court under section 30 of the Act a right of appeal to the Court of Appeal.
