A Bill

Intituled

An Act to provide for the incorporation of the Guyana Swatantra Vidwat Parished commonly known as the Guyana Pandit's Council and for purposes connected therewith.

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

A.D. 1966

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Guyana Pandits' Council short Two. (Incorporation) Act, 1966.
 - 2. In this Act unless context otherwise requires Interpretation.

"Board of Examiners" means the Board of Examiners established under the provisions of section 13 of this Act;

"Executive Committee" means the Executive Committee of the Guyana Pandits' Council appointed or elected in accordance with the constitution and By-laws of the Guyana Pandits' Council;

"Pandit" means a Brahmin who is learned in the teachings of the Sanatan Dharma and who is qualified to perform the functions of a Pandit under the provisions of section 14 of this Act;

"successors in office" means the persons appointed or elected from time to time in accordance with the constitution and By-laws of the Guyana Pandits' Council.

President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer of the Executive Committee, and the other members of the Executive Committee, and their successors in office shall be a body corporate and shall have the name of the Executive Committee of the Guyana Pandits' Council, with perpetual succession and a common seal with power to sue and be sued in the name of the Guyana, Pandits' Council, hereinafter referred to as the Council.

Power to so-quire and dis-pose of

The Executive Committee shall have full power to purchase, accept by way of gift, legacy or devise, take, hold, enjoy, sell, transport, mortgage, lease, invest, and otherwise deal with and dispose of all property movable or immovable of whatever nature or kind SOCVET.

Vesting of property.

- All property, movable or immovable of whatever nature or kind soever, heretofore and hereafter bequeathed or devised by will or otherwise given to or acquired by any person or body of persons on behalf of or for the use or benefit of the Council, shall be held by and is hereby vested in and shall be deemed to be the property of the Executive Committee.
- All property vested in or hereafter acquired by the Executive Committee shall be held by the Executive Committee for the use and benefit of the Council.

Disposition of immoveble

No immovable property held by the Executive Committee by virtue of the provisions of this Act shall be transported, leased, mortgaged or otherwise ideaxe to pasodsip by the authority of a resolution of the Executive Committee:

Evidence of membership of the Bracutive Committee.

8. A statement that any person named therein has been appointed or elected to be President, Vice-President, Tressurer, Secretary, or a member of the Executive Committee, purporting to be signed by the President or Vice-President and the Secretary of the Executive Committee shall be prima facie evidence of the said fact.

membership of the Brecutive Committee not to derogate from powers of the Executive Committee

No change in the membership of the Executive Committee shall derogate from the title or powers of the said Executive Commentee in respect of any property or estate or interest therein.

Seal of the Committee

- 10. (1) The Executive Committee shall have seal with its name engraved thereon in legible characters.
- (2) The seal of the Executive Committee shall not be affixed to any deed, transport, mortgage, cancellation of mortgage, lease, transfer, agreement, or other like document except by the authority of a resolution of the Executive Committee, and shall be affixed by the President or Vice-President, and the Treasurer of the Executive Committee or by any two persons appointed by resolution of the Executive Committee for this purpose.
- (3) The persons authorised by subsection (2) of this section to affix the seal of the Executive Committee to any document shall do so in the presence of each other.
- All process which is required to be served on the Executive Committee shall be deemed to be sufficiently served—

(a) if a copy thereof is left with the President or the Secretary of the Executive Committee at any place within Guyana or with an adult inmate at the place of residence in Guyana of the President or the Secretary; or

(b) if a copy thereof is published in the Official Gazette and in one newspaper circulating in Guyana.

12. (1) All the assets of the trustees of the Guyana Swatantra transfer of assets and discharge of certain obligat-Vidwat Parishad shall vest in the Executive Committee.

- (2) The Executive Committee shall discharge the obligations and perform the functions heretofore discharged and performed by the trustees of the Guyana Swatantra Vidwat Parishad.
- 13. (1) The Executive Committee shall appoint a Board of Establishment Examiners consisting of six members and shall appoint a person to be Examiners. Secretary of the Board of Examiners.
- (2) The Executive Committee may grant leave of absence to any member of the Board of Examiners.
- (3) Where leave of absence has been granted under subsection (2) of this section, the Executive Committee may appoint another person to act in the place of the member of the Board of Examiners who has been granted such leave.
- (4) The Executive Committee may, at any time, revoke the appointment of a member of the Board of Examiners.
- 14. (1) It shall be the duty of the Board of Examiners to conduct putes of the Board of examinations of all persons who desire to perform the functions of a Board of Pandit and to award certificates of competency to such persons to perform such functions.

- (2) No person shall perform the functions of a Pandit unless he has been awarded a certificate under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section.
- (3) This section shall not apply to any person of the Hindu religion who before the commencement of this Act solemnized a marriage in accordance with the provisions of the Marriage Ordinance or the Indian Labour Ordinance.

The Executive Committee may, with the approval of the Power to Minister for the time being charged with responsibility for education, make regular make regulations-

- (a) regulating the conduct of any examinations which may be conducted by the Board of Examiners under the provisions of section 14 of this Act, and any matters ancillary to or connected with any such examinations; and generally, for carrying out the provisions of this
- Nothing in this Act shall be deemed to affect any right saving the rights of Her of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors, or of any Majesty. body politic or corporate, of any other person or persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, from, through or under them.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to incorporate in Guyana certain persons as the Executive Committee of the Guyana Pandits' Council and to vest in the Committee all property in Guyana held by or vested in any person or bedy of persons en behalf of, er for the use or benefit of the Guyana Pandits' Council.

The Bill also contains provisions whereby the Executive Committee may acquire and dispose of property, and provides for the establishment of a Board of Examiners to conduct examinations for the award of certificates to perform the functions of a Pandit.
