"Provided t at notwi standing the foregoing requirement of this su section we ere such place or premises are situated within a locatio mentioned in section 5 of the Amerindian Ord ance, the Minister responsible for finance may authorise tessue of a licence under the said section 18 to any perso who wo dentitled to establish a shop therein."

EXPLANA ORY MEMORANDUM

The provisions of subs ction (15) of section 53 of the Tax Ordinance prohibit the issue of ertain trading licences to persons desirous of establishing shops within ten miles of an area held under a licence to mine or to search for gol or precious stones unless such persons are the holders of a licence to t de in gold and precious stones. To assist in developing Amerindian s ttlements, it is intended to encourage therein the establishment of shops, licensed under section 18 of that Ordinance. However, as may yof these settlements fall within the area prescribed in the said subsettion it is sought by this Bill to provide exemption from the require ent to hold a licence to trade in gold and precious stones where the trade der seeks to establish such a shop within a place mentioned in
