AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) A.D. 1962 Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:-

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction Short title. (Procedure) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1962, and shall be construed and read with the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same
- 2. The first schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed Repeal of first schedule and the following schedule substituted therefor -

OBJECTS AND REASONS

There is provision under the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) Ordinance, Chapter 15, whereby certain indictable offences may be tried summarily with the consent of the accused. This Bill seeks to add to the list of such offences.
