Intituled

AN ACT to provide for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet the expenditure (not otherwise lawfully charged on the Consolidated Fund) of Guyana for the fiscal year ending 31st December, 2023, estimates whereof have been approved by the National Assembly, and for the appropriation of those sums for the specified purposes, in conformity with the Constitution.

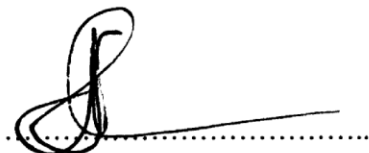
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| <i>Short title.</i> | 1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (No. 3 for 2023) Act 2023. |
| <i>Issue from the Consolidated Fund authorised</i>
<i>No. 20 of 2003.</i> | 2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund of such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate the gross of twenty five billion, nine hundred and forty-three million, seven hundred and forty-three thousand, two hundred and forty-two dollars (\$25,943,743,242), necessary to meet the expenditure of Guyana for the fiscal year ending on 31 st December, 2023, is hereby authorised in accordance with article 219 of the Constitution and sections 24 and 41 of the Fiscal Management and Accountability Act 2003. |
| <i>Appropriation. Schedule.</i> | 3. Every sum set out in the Schedule is hereby appropriated for the purposes specified therein with effect from 1 st January, 2023. |
