## A BILL Intituled

AN ACT to amend the Fire Service Act.

A.D. 2009.

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short title. Cap. 22:02 1. This Act which amends the Fire Service Act, may be cited as the Fire Service (Amendment) Act 2009.

Amendment of section 24 of the Principal Act. 2. Section 24 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting, for the words "three hundred dollars" and "three months" the words "one hundred thousand dollars" and "six months", respectively.

Amendment of section 25 of the Principal Act.

3. Section 25 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting, for the words "four hundred dollars", "seven hundred and fifty dollars", and "twelve months" the words "one hundred thousand dollars", "one hundred and fifty thousand dollars" and "two years", respectively.

Amendment of section 26 of the Principal Act. 4. Section 26 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting, for the words "three hundred dollars" and "three months" the words "one hundred and fifty thousand dollars" and "six months", respectively.

Amendment of section 27 of the Principal Act. 5. Section 27 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting, for the words "one hundred and fifty dollars" the words "twenty-five thousand dollars".

## **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

This Bill seeks to amend the Fire Service Act (Cap. 22:02)

Clause 1 sets out the short title of the Bill.

Clauses 2 to 5 seek to amend sections 24, 25, 26, and 27 respectively to enhance the fines payable and other penalties to reflect current values.
