ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

THE LABOUR ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 103).

UNDER SECTION 8(3) OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:--

1. This Order may be cited as the Minimum Wages (Shirt and Garment Workers) (Amendment) Order, 1961 and shall be construed and read with the Minimum Wages (Shirt and Garment Workers) Order 1960*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order.

2. The definition of the word "worker" appearing in article 2 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion after the word "factory" of the words "but does not include a person employed in an establishment whose business is wholly or mainly retail bespoke tailoring or dressmaking".
